Colleen found a lump in her breast when she was 27 and between jobs without health insurance. She almost ignored it because she couldn't afford private medical care, but instead came to Planned Parenthood for a breast exam. Colleen's provider helped her catch her invasive Stage II breast cancer early.

She went through chemotherapy, radiation, a lumpectomy and five years of hormone treatment and is healthy today because of early detection at Planned Parenthood.

> In 2014, Planned Parenthood performed 360,000 breast exams, and detected cancer and precancerous abnormalities early for 72,000 women, but [Member of Congress] voted to prohibit patients from getting that care at Planned Parenthood.
