Dear Senator:

I am writing on behalf of the approximately 850,000 members of the United Steelworkers (USW) in strong support of the nomination of Robert Lighthizer to serve as the United States Trade Representative. It is far past time for Congress to act on this nomination which is critical to this Administration's stated goal of fighting for American production and jobs.

Mr. Lighthizer is a man who comes to the job with unparalleled experience and qualifications. He has been a leader in promoting policies to advance the interests of domestic producers and workers while also embracing the need for the U.S. to continue its robust engagement in the world economy. He is a man of great integrity who has the ability to develop consensus around the policies that must guide this nation in the future and the understanding of the need to have a firm, but reasoned hand, at the negotiating table.

The time for labels is over; free trade and protectionism should become terms of the past. It is clear from the reality of today's trading relationships that a pragmatic approach is needed to confront the challenges we face and to take advantages of the opportunities that exist.
