## A BILL

To amend the Agricultural Act of 2014 to reduce county yield disparities for agriculture risk coverage.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "ARC-CO Improvement5 Act".

## 6 SEC. 2. COUNTY YIELD DISPARITIES.

7 (a) ACTUAL CROP REVENUES.—Section 1117(b) of
8 the Agricultural Act of 2014 (7 U.S.C. 9017(b)) is amend9 ed—

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1	(1) in paragraph $(1)(A)$ , by inserting "(includ-
2	ing any adjustments under paragraph (3))" after
3	"Secretary"; and
4	(2) by adding at the end the following:
5	"(3) County yield disparities.—
6	"(A) IN GENERAL.—In the case of county
7	coverage, the Secretary may adjust county
8	yields under paragraph (1)(A) to reduce dis-
9	parities between neighboring and nearby coun-
10	ties with similar soils and climate that cannot
11	be explained by a localized weather event.
12	"(B) Aggregate estimated payment
13	The Secretary shall ensure that all adjustments
14	made under this paragraph are balanced so the
15	aggregate amount of payments made under this
16	section as a result of the adjustments for a crop
17	year do not increase.
18	"(C) Options.—
19	"(i) IN GENERAL.—If the Secretary
20	makes adjustments under this paragraph,
21	the Secretary shall make the adjustments
22	in accordance with clause (ii) or (iii).
23	"(ii) VARIATIONS WITHIN A STATE.—
24	"(I) IN GENERAL.—Subject to
25	subparagraph (B), the Secretary shall

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allow State committees of the Farm
Service Agency to review and rec-
ommend adjustments to the initial
yield estimates before the adjustments
become final to reduce unexplained
variation between neighboring or
nearby counties with similar soils and
climate.
"(II) REVIEW AND APPROVAL.—
The Secretary shall review and ap-
prove or reject adjustments rec-
ommended under subclause (I) before
the adjustments become final.
"(iii) VARIATIONS ALONG STATE
BOUNDARIES.—
"(I) IN GENERAL.—Subject to
subparagraph (B), the Secretary shall
allow State committees of the Farm
Service Agency or the national office
of the Farm Service Agency, in con-

8	(b) Additional Duties of the Secretary.—Sec-
9	tion 1117(g) of the Agricultural Act of 2014 (7 U.S.C.
10	9017(g)) is amended—
11	(1) in paragraph $(3)$ , by striking "and" after
12	the semicolon at the end;
13	(2) in paragraph $(4)(B)$ , by striking the period
14	at the end and insert a semicolon; and
15	(3) by adding at the end the following:
16	"(5) in the case of county coverage, prioritize
17	the use of yields from sources that provide the great-
18	est geographic coverage of county-level data from
19	the same source; and
20	"(6) in the case of county coverage—
21	"(A) use the yield, benchmark revenue and
22	payment rate based on the county of the phys-
23	ical location of the farm; and
24	"(B) in the case of a farm that crosses
25	county boundaries—

"(i) split the base acres on a pro rata
 basis based on the relative quantity of
 cropland in each county; and
 "(ii) calculate any payments on that
 same pro rata basis.".
