Dear Chairman Gowdy and Ranking Member Cummings:

I write in response to your October 17, 2017, letter to the Department of Energy (DOE) regarding the use of government-owned or private non-commercial aircraft by DOE non-career officials. This is a follow-up request to your September 26, 2017 letter on the same topic.

For the time period identified in your October 17, 2017 letter, January 1, 2016 to January 19, 2017, the Department has identified one instance when a DOE non-career official used private non-commercial aircraft and has identified three instances when DOE non-career officials used government-owned aircraft or chartered aircraft. The enclosed documents contain the requested information for each of the identified trips. During the time period in question, senior DOE non-career officials may have also traveled with the President and the Vice President on government-owned aircraft and with senior officials from other agencies. This response does not address this travel as such travel arrangements would not have been made by DOE. This response also does not address any personal travel that may have occurred on private non-commercial aircraft for which there was no taxpayer or DOE involvement.

Deputy Secretary Shorwood-Randall and Staff, March 8, 2016

Deputy Secretary of Bnergy Blizabeth Sherwood-Randall and staff are scheduled to use a Learjot Model 75, operated by Southern Company, for official travel originating from Augusta, GA (AGS) to Meridian, MS (MBI), and from Meridian, MS to Atlanta Hartsfield Airport (ATL) on March 8, 2016. The Deputy Secretary is scheduled to visit Southern Company and attend a four and briefing of projects at their Vogtle and Kemper Plants on that date.

Travel on the Southern Company alreraft is most time effective because it will save over 10 hours time in route and will preclude the need for travel and lodging for one day for the Deputy Secretary and her accompanying staff. Moreover, if the delegation were to fly commercial, it would require multiple connections, and a missed connecting flight might result in additional lodging and time based on limited flight availability.



Deputy Secretary of Energy Elizabeth Sherwood-Randall is tentatively scheduled to use a Bonneville Power Administration Beechcraft King Air turbo-prop airplane for official travel to Grand Coulee Dam, Grand Coulee, Washington. She will attend a tour and briefing of projects at the Dam and then travel by the same aircraft to Boeing Field/King County International Airport, Seattle, Washington.


