Dear Chairmen Frelinghuysen and Cole and Ranking Members Lowey and DeLauro:

The school shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida demonstrates the need for school districts to have the appropriate resources at their disposal to provide students with important support services. This need is one of the reasons we authorized the Student Support and Academic Enrichment Grants (SSAEG) in the *Every Student Succeeds Act* (ESSA). The SSAEG program provides formula grants to school districts to support a variety of needs, including student mental health services and professional development for school personnel in crisis management and school-based violence prevention strategies. Schools need a multi-pronged approach to ensure they are doing everything they can to provide a safe and secure learning environment for their students. Resources from these grants can be a key piece in their approach, but only if the funding is sufficient to ensure effective distribution by formula.

As your Committee prepares funding legislation for the remainder of FY 2018, we ask that you make funding SSAEG a top priority and appropriate the authorized level of \$1.6 billion for this important program. SSAEG FY18 funding must ensure school districts are able to maximize the program's flexibility to support and protect students and educators.
