Dear Mr. Dudis:

This letter is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request number *F2017-842611* addressed to the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL). Your request was assigned to the Employee Benefits Security Administration (EBSA) for response. You are requesting records of communications between the U.S. Chamber of Commerce and the DOL's EBSA from January 1, 2016 to the present.

On February 5, 2018, we provided an interim response which included two pages responsive to your request. EBSA has completed its search for responsive records and located approximately 87 pages/records that are responsive to communications between the U.S. Chamber of Commerce and the DOL's EBSA from January 1, 2016 to the date of your request. These records are enclosed herewith and have been redacted to effect Exemption 6. Exemption 6 (5 U.S.C. 522(b)(6)) permits the withholding of information that would constitute an invasion of personal privacy.

In accordance the Department regulation 29 CFR 70.40(c)(l), dated May 30, 2006, requestors are charged for search, review, and reproduction costs. However, the fee is being waived since the total is under the de minimis costs threshold of \$15.00 (29 CFR 70.43(a).)

You may administratively appeal by writing to the Solicitor of Labor within 90 days from the date of this letter if you are not satisfied with the response to this request. The appeal must state in writing the grounds for the appeal, and it may include any supporting statements or arguments, but such statements are not required. In order to facilitate processing of the appeal, please include your mailing address and daytime telephone number, as well as a copy of the

initial request and copy of this letter. The envelope and letter of the appeal should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal." Any amendment to the appeal must be made in writing and received prior to a decision. The appeal should be addressed to the Solicitor of Labor, Division of Management and Administrative Legal Services, U.S. Department of Labor, 200 Constitution Avenue, NW, Room N2420, Washington, DC 20210. Re: Necessity of Extending the Applicability Date of the Fiduciary Rule Regulation and Associated Prohibited Transaction Exemptions

Secretary Borzi:

The U.S. Chamber of Commerce ("the Chamber") is the world's largest business organization representing the interests of more than 3 million businesses of all sizes, sectors, and regions. Most of our members sponsor retirement plans for their employees, and therefore have a fiduciary obligation to ensure that their plans are functioning properly for their participants and beneficiaries.

Based on conversations with our diverse membership, we are requesting an extension of the applicability date of the fiduciary regulation because the current 12 month applicability date is simply too short, and will result in significant disruptions to our members' plans. Our members are also very concerned about the ability of their retirement plan participants to receive advice regarding rollovers and other distributions from their plans to Individual Retirement Accounts ("IRAs"), which are essential services for retirement planning and retirement asset portability.

When the final fiduciary regulation was published over five months ago, we expressed our serious concern that 12 months simply was not enough time for plans and service providers to make the extremely broad changes required to comply with the new rules. We noted that the Department of Labor ("the Department") frequently provides longer implementation periods for far less significant regulations, and predicted that such a short implementation period for one of the most sweeping rules ever issued by the Department likely would result in material disruptions for

plans and participants. Now, with less than seven months left before the rule applies, it is clear that our concern was well-founded. Despite best efforts, made in good faith, by service providers and plan fiduciaries, and despite spending hundreds of millions of dollars already, many financial services providers are at real risk of being unable to comply with the new requirements by April 10, 2017.

Further, despite its promises to do so, the Department has issued no guidance or other interpretive assistance to address the wide range of crucial questions and concerns raised by the regulated community. While the Department did provide technical corrections, these were largely corrections of typographical and similar errors, not guidance needed to implement broad new rules fundamentally changing the provision of advice and other financial services to more than \$15 trillion in retirement savings. The scope of change is incredibly broad, and the financial consequences of making a mistake are immense.

DOL mandated that a vast segment of the financial services industry fundamentally change how it services plans and IRAs, and created new legal obligations and liabilities, but has not provided essential guidance to interpret final rules that the Department itself acknowledged would not by themselves be sufficient to address implementation questions. We are nearly at the halfway mark, and many service providers are still trying to understand their obligations, develop their business plans for compliance, and create training modules for thousands of advisors and staff, making it increasingly unlikely that they will have the necessary time to implement the technological and procedural changes needed to comply by April 10.

In recognition of this reality, we request that the Department amend the fiduciary regulation to extend the applicability date from April 10, 2017 to at least April 10, 2018, and to similarly extend the applicability date of the full requirements of the Best Interest Contract Exemption from January 1, 2018 to January 1, 2019.

We originally requested in our comment letters three years to implement these rules properly, and we still believe that amount of time to be necessary for a carefully considered and orderly transition to the new standards. However, the roughly 12 additional months we request here is the bare minimum necessary to make it possible for any practicable transition to occur. We make this request because our members and their workers need a functional retirement system.

Dear Messrs. Johnson and Hirschmann:

I am writing in response to your letter requesting a twelve-month extension of the applicability dates of the Department of Labor's conflict of interest rule on fiduciary investment advice, and related prohibited transactions exemptions, published in the Federal Register on April 8, 2016.

Hardworking Americans deserve access to retirement advice that is in their best interest and that is not tainted by their advisers' conflicts of interest. This is the simple premise underlying the Department's rule and exemptions. Middle-class retirement savers especially need to receive advice that is in their best interest, because they can least afford to have their savings dissipated by unnecessarily high hidden fees and poor performing investments. Every year, retirement investors lose billions of dollars because of conflicted advice. The Department expects that the final fiduciary rule and related exemptions will both improve investor outcomes and increase the likelihood that middle-class investors will seek retirement advice in the first place, as they can now trust that their adviser will put their best interests first, resulting in better advice and lower costs.

The Department recognized that firms and advisers would need time to adjust to the new regulatory framework, and gave them an extended period to come into compliance. In the preamble to the final rule, the Department noted that it was important for the rule to become effective on the earliest possible date to provide certainty to plans, plan fiduciaries, plan participants, beneficiaries and IRA owners, as well as to service providers that the rule is final and not subject to further amendment or modification. However, at the same time, the Department determined that an applicability date of one year after the publication of the final rule in the Federal Register was appropriate and should provide enough time for plans and their affected service providers to adjust to the basic change from non-fiduciary to fiduciary status.

Additionally, the Department provided a further transition period under the Best Interest Contract Exemption with a full compliance deadline delayed to January 1, 2018, still well over a year away. See 81 FR 20992, 20993 (April 8, 2016). During that transition period, affected service providers will only be required to comply with more limited conditions, including acknowledging their fiduciary status, adhering to the best interest standard, and making basic disclosures of conflicts of interest.

Even after the applicability date of the new rule, the Department's general approach to implementation will be marked by an emphasis on assisting, rather than citing violations and imposing penalties on, plans, plan fiduciaries, financial institutions and others who are working diligently and in good faith to understand and come into compliance with the new rule and exemptions. The Department has been and will continue working together with plan sponsors, financial institutions, recordkeepers, insurance companies and other stakeholders to help them come into compliance with the new rule and exemptions. We recognize that there will be a period of adjustment as firms work to comply with these important reforms, but we are very encouraged by the many discussions we have had with affected service providers, as well as by the many steps that firms have already taken to position themselves to compete in a market governed by a best interest standard, and to ensure timely compliance.

Our collaborations with stakeholders resulted in our recent release of a first set of frequently asked questions (FAQs) that focus on the prohibited transaction exemptions, such as the Best Interest Contract Exemption and prohibited transaction exemption (PTE) 84-24. While these FAQs are certainly designed to facilitate compliance, they provide no support for extending the applicability dates, and in no way justify any failure to prepare for timely compliance. We expect to soon release additional FAQs, which will focus on more definitional questions regarding the rule itself and on issues that are of interest to consumers. We expect to continue to release FAQs on a rolling basis, as appropriate. If you have specific additional questions that you would like us to address, we would welcome your suggestions.

We do not believe it would be consistent with the sound administration of the law or in the best interests of America's retirement savers for the Department to extend further the applicability dates of these important consumer protection reforms, especially given the significance of the continuing monetary harm that would occur to retirement investors without the rule's changes.

We appreciate your interest in this important issue affecting the retirement security of millions of America's workers and their families, and we look forward to continuing to work with you and your members on implementing these important consumer protection reforms.



## Why You Should Care About the Multiemployer Pension Crisis

In the midst of debates over tax reform, budgets, and national security, there is a little-known crisis rising — multiemployer pension funding. You may have heard of the <u>multiemployer pension crisis</u> and thought of it as an unfortunate issue, but one that had nothing to do with you. Well, without a legislative resolution, you could be affected.

Currently, over one million retirees in multiemployer plans are in danger of losing benefits because the plans that pay them will go bankrupt. In addition, the federal agency that acts as a backstop — the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation — is also in danger of bankruptcy. Without a resolution to this crisis, there could be millions lost in retirement benefits. This loss alone will put a strain on local economies where these retirees will have less money for consumption and some may be forced to rely on state assistance.

There will also be an <u>adverse impact on employers in these plans</u>. Because of the current rules, employers cannot leave these plans without paying large sums or claiming bankruptcy. Both of these results negatively impact the ability to provide jobs, make capital investments, or increase salaries. Finally, taxpayers may ultimately be on the hook if Congress decides to replace the lost benefits with taxpayer funding. Even if Congress does not provide direct assistance, all will feel the consequences of fewer jobs, less consumerism, and greater reliance on state programs.

The story of multiemployer plans is complicated. To provide context, the U.S. Chamber has issued a report, <u>The Multiemployer Pension Plan Crisis: The History, Legislation, and What's Next?</u> The report provides an overview of the current multiemployer crisis, an in-depth analysis of the events leading up to the crisis, attempts to fix it, and the current proposals to address the crisis.

There will not be any easy solutions to this crisis but if nothing is done, the consequences will be devastating. We call on all interested parties — and all parties should be interested — to encourage Congress to find a solution that minimizes the negative impact of this crisis.



The American College of Employee Benefits Counsel Announces Competition for Best

The American College of Employee Benefits Counsel Announces Competition for Best Simplification Proposal

The American College of Employee Benefits Counsel announced today, on Labor Day, a competition for the best original legislative proposal to simplify an aspect of employee benefits law. The award, established through a generous commitment of David Gordon, a former president of the College, will provide a prize of \$10,000. The College anticipates sponsoring the competition annually for at least the next five years.

The College is composed of senior employee benefit lawyers who have been selected by their peers for their contributions to the study and improvement of employee benefits law. Its diverse membership includes lawyers who represent plan participants, employers, unions, employee benefit plans, and the government agencies that regulate them. (Further information about the College, its activities, and its history, is available at www.acebc.com.)

## Purpose of the Award

Employee benefits law is necessarily complex but also more complex than necessary. It is complex because Congress, in writing the law, seeks to balance numerous competing concerns, such as encouraging employers to establish and maintain plans, protecting employees, and controlling tax costs. It is more complex than necessary because there is no systematic effort over time to identify and purge from the law complex provisions whose contributions to the employee benefits system no longer justify their costs to the employees who participate in employee benefit plans or the employers who sponsor them.

Mr. Gordon conceived the simplification award as a means of addressing this problem. He said that complexity in employee benefits law is like the weather: "every experienced benefits lawyer complains about it but no one does anything about it."

And the costs are real and significant. For example, participants are provided with lengthy documents too complex for the average participant to understand. Complex legal requirements designed four decades ago for a pre-computer age or to address a once relevant issue that is now obsolete, remain in the law despite costing employee benefit plans millions of dollars in compliance expense, resources that could better be used to improve the retirement and health benefits that these plans deliver to employees.

The competition is designed to allow professionals who work in the employee benefits field, academics, employers who sponsor plans, and employees who participate in them, to suggest amendments to the law that would reduce costly and unnecessary complexity. Submissions must enhance, or at least have no adverse effect on, protections for and rights of employees and plan participants.

## Details of Award

The award winner will be selected each year by the ACEBC Simplification Award Committee, which is composed of Members of the College. The Award Committee's selection of a winner will be subject to the approval of the ACEBC's Board of Governors. Detailed rules, eligibility and selection criteria, and submissions procedures are available at <a href="https://www.acebc.com/simplification-award-rules">https://www.acebc.com/simplification-award-rules</a>. A list of FAQs is also posted at the website, and may be updated during the competition as the Committee deems appropriate.

Criteria for judging submissions include the degree of simplification, prospects for enactment, and originality.

The initial award will be presented at the College's Annual Meeting and Induction Dinner to be held in Fall 2018. For a submission to be eligible for the 2018 award, it must be submitted in accordance with the rules linked above, on or before April 1, 2018.





## Why You Should Care About the Multiemployer Pension Crisis

In the midst of debates over tax reform, budgets, and national security, there is a little-known crisis rising — multiemployer pension funding. You may have heard of the <u>multiemployer pension crisis</u> and thought of it as an unfortunate issue, but one that had nothing to do with you. Well, without a legislative resolution, you could be affected.

Currently, over one million retirees in multiemployer plans are in danger of losing benefits because the plans that pay them will go bankrupt. In addition, the federal agency that acts as a backstop — the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation — is also in danger of bankruptcy. Without a resolution to this crisis, there could be millions lost in retirement benefits. This loss alone will put a strain on local economies where these retirees will have less money for consumption and some may be forced to rely on state assistance.

There will also be an <u>adverse impact on employers in these plans</u>. Because of the current rules, employers cannot leave these plans without paying large sums or claiming bankruptcy. Both of these results negatively impact the ability to provide jobs, make capital investments, or increase salaries. Finally, taxpayers may ultimately be on the hook if Congress decides to replace the lost benefits with taxpayer funding. Even if Congress does not provide direct assistance, all will feel the consequences of fewer jobs, less consumerism, and greater reliance on state programs.

The story of multiemployer plans is complicated. To provide context, the U.S. Chamber has issued a report, *The Multiemployer Pension Plan Crisis: The History, Legislation, and What's Next?*. The report provides an overview of the current multiemployer crisis, an in-depth analysis of the events leading up to the crisis, attempts to fix it, and the current proposals to address the crisis.

There will not be any easy solutions to this crisis but if nothing is done, the consequences will be devastating. We call on all interested parties — and all parties should be interested — to encourage Congress to find a solution that minimizes the negative impact of this crisis.
