Dear Mr. Abramovich:

On Wednesday, April 18, 2018, at 10:00 a.m., in room 253 of the Russell Senate Office Building, the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation will hold an oversight hearing to examine the scourge of unsolicited robocalling.

You are uniquely qualified to answer questions that will assist the Commerce Committee's oversight responsibilities regarding unsolicited robocalls. On October 10, 2017, you received a letter of inquiry from the Committee regarding your involvement with a number of companies that have allegedly made approximately 100 million robocalls during a three-month period in 2016. In fact, on June 22, 2017, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) proposed a \$120 million forfeiture against you based upon its finding that you apparently knowingly violated the Truth in Caller ID Act, 47 U.S.C. Sec. 227(e), and Section 64.1604(a) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. Sec. 64.1604(a). On November 3, 2017, through your counsel, you informed the Committee that you would not be providing information in response to the Committee's inquiry.

By letter dated March 14, 2018, you received an invitation from the Committee to appear voluntarily to provide oral testimony for the April 18, 2018 oversight hearing referred to above. On March 19, 2018, you informed the Committee, through your counsel, that you would be declining the Committee's invitation to testify voluntarily.

In light of your decision to decline the Committee's invitation, and refusal to provide information in response to the Committee's inquiry, a subpoena requiring your appearance before the Committee has been issued.

We remain committed to a respectful examination of the important issue of unsolicited robocalls and look forward to your testimony on the matter. Enclosed are instructions for the submission of testimony to the Committee.
