# **COMPLAINT**

Plaintiff Federation for American Immigration Reform ("FAIR") brings this action against U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement ("ICE") to compel compliance with the Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. § 552. Plaintiff alleges the following grounds:

# JURISDICTION AND VENUE

1. The Court has jurisdiction over this action pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(B)

and 28 U.S.C. § 1331.

2. Venue is proper in this district pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1391(e).

#### **PARTIES**

3. Plaintiff FAIR ("Plaintiff") is a non-profit educational foundation organized under the laws of the District of Columbia and having its principal place of business at 25

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Massachusetts Ave., NW, Suite 330, Washington, DC 20001. Plaintiff seeks to educate the citizenry on and increase public awareness of immigration issues, and hold the nation's leaders accountable for enforcing the nation's immigration laws. In furtherance of its public interest mission, Plaintiff regularly requests access to the public records of federal agencies, entities, and offices, and disseminates its findings to the public.

4. Defendant ICE is an agency of the U.S. Government and is headquartered at 500 12th Street, SW, Washington, D.C. 20536. ICE has possession, custody, and control of certain public records to which Plaintiff seeks access.

# **STATEMENT OF FACTS**

5. On January 26, 2018, Plaintiff submitted a FOIA request by email to ICE seeking access to the following public records:

- Any and all records on ICE detainers placed on illegal aliens arrested on criminal charges in all 50 States, to include Puerto Rico and its U.S. territories, in which law enforcement agencies did not honor the detainer requests and released the aliens.
- 2) Any and all records where law enforcement agencies released the illegal aliens from custody and [these aliens] were subsequently arrested again on other criminal charges in all 50 States, to include Puerto Rico and its U.S. territories.
- 6. Plaintiff received an acknowledgement email dated February 15, 2018, from ICE

assigning the FOIA request the tracking number 2018-ICFO-20146.

7. Pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 552(a)(6)(A)(i), ICE was required to determine whether to

comply with Plaintiff's FOIA request within twenty (20) working days after receipt of each

request and to notify Plaintiff immediately of its determination, the reasons therefor, and the

right to appeal any adverse determination. Accordingly, ICE's determination of Plaintiff's FOIA

request was due by February 26, 2018, at the latest.

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8. As of the date of this Complaint, ICE has failed to: (i) determine whether to comply with Plaintiff's FOIA request; (ii) notify Plaintiff of any such determinations or the reasons for such determinations; (iii) advise Plaintiff of the right to appeal any adverse determination; or (iv) produce the requested records or otherwise demonstrate that the requested records are exempt from production.

9. Because ICE has failed to comply with the time limit set forth in 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(A) with respect to the FOIA request, Plaintiff is deemed to have exhausted any and all administrative remedies with respect to the request, pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(C).

#### COUNT 1 (Violation of FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552)

10. Plaintiff realleges paragraphs 1 through 9 as if fully stated herein.

11. Defendant is unlawfully withholding public records requested by Plaintiff pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552.

12. Plaintiff is being irreparably harmed by reason of Defendant's unlawful withholding of the requested public records, and Plaintiff will continue to be irreparably harmed unless Defendant is compelled to conform its conduct to the requirements of the law.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff respectfully requests that the Court: (1) order Defendant to conduct a search for any and all records responsive to Plaintiff's FOIA request, and demonstrate that it employed search methods reasonably likely to lead to the discovery of records responsive to Plaintiff's FOIA request; (2) order Defendant to produce, by a date certain, any and all non-exempt records responsive to Plaintiff's FOIA request and a Vaughn index of any responsive records withheld under claim of exemption; (3) enjoin Defendant from continuing to withhold any and all non-exempt records responsive to Plaintiff's FOIA request; (4) grant Plaintiff an award of attorneys' fees and other litigation costs reasonably incurred in this action pursuant to 5

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U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(E); and (5) grant Plaintiff such other relief as the Court deems just and proper.

Authority for Civil Cover Sheet

The JS-44 civil cover sheet and the information contained herein neither replaces nor supplements the filings and services of pleadings or other papers as required by law, except as provided by local rules of court. This form, approved by the Judicial Conference of the United States in September 1974, is required for the use of the Clerk of Court for the purpose of initiating the civil docket sheet. Consequently, a civil cover sheet is submitted to the Clerk of Court for each civil complaint filed. Listed below are tips for completing the civil cover sheet. These tips coincide with the Roman Numerals on the cover sheet.

- I. COUNTY OF RESIDENCE OF FIRST LISTED PLAINTIFF/DEFENDANT (b) County of residence: Use 11001 to indicate plaintiff if resident of Washington, DC, 88888 if plaintiff is resident of United States but not Washington, DC, and 99999 if plaintiff is outside the United States.
- III. CITIZENSHIP OF PRINCIPAL PARTIES: This section is completed <u>only</u> if diversity of citizenship was selected as the Basis of Jurisdiction under Section II.
- IV. CASE ASSIGNMENT AND NATURE OF SUIT: The assignment of a judge to your case will depend on the category you select that best represents the <u>primary</u> cause of action found in your complaint. You may select only <u>one</u> category. You <u>must</u> also select <u>one</u> corresponding nature of suit found under the category of the case.
- VI. CAUSE OF ACTION: Cite the U.S. Civil Statute under which you are filing and write a brief statement of the primary cause.
- VIII. RELATED CASE(S), IF ANY: If you indicated that there is a related case, you must complete a related case form, which may be obtained from the Clerk's Office.

Because of the need for accurate and complete information, you should ensure the accuracy of the information provided prior to signing the form.
