## Amendment to H.R. 5515 Offered by Mr. Smith of Washington

At the appropriate place in title X, insert the following:

1	SEC. 10 NATIONAL COMMISSION ON MILITARY AVIA-
2	TION SAFETY.
3	(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established the Na-
4	tional Commission on Military Aviation Safety (in this sec-
5	tion referred to as the "Commission").
6	(b) Membership.—
7	(1) Composition.—The Commission shall be
8	composed of eight members, of whom—
9	(A) four shall be appointed by the Presi-
10	dent;
11	(B) one shall be appointed by the Chair-
12	man of the Committee on Armed Services of
13	the Senate;
14	(C) one shall be appointed by the Ranking
15	Member of the Committee on Armed Services of
16	the Senate;
17	(D) one shall be appointed by the Chair-
18	man of the Committee on Armed Services of
19	the House of Representatives; and

(E) one shall be appointed by the Ranking
 Member of the Committee on Armed Services of
 the House of Representatives.

4 (2) APPOINTMENT DATE.—The appointments of
5 the members of the Commission shall be made not
6 later than 90 days after the date of the enactment
7 of this Act.

8 (3) Effect of lack of appointment by AP-9 POINTMENT DATE.—If one or more appointments 10 under subparagraph (A) of paragraph (1) is not 11 made by the appointment date specified in para-12 graph (2), the authority to make such appointment 13 or appointments shall expire, and the number of 14 members of the Commission shall be reduced by the 15 number equal to the number of appointments so not 16 made. If an appointment under subparagraph (B), 17 (C), (D), or (E) of paragraph (1) is not made by the 18 appointment date specified in paragraph (2), the au-19 thority to make an appointment under such subpara-20 graph shall expire, and the number of members of 21 the Commission shall be reduced by the number 22 equal to the number otherwise appointable under 23 such subparagraph.

24 (4) EXPERTISE.—In making appointments
25 under this subsection, consideration should be given

to individuals with expertise in military aviation
 training, aviation technology, military aviation oper ations, aircraft sustainment and repair, aviation per sonnel policy, and reserve component policy.

5 (c) PERIOD OF APPOINTMENT; VACANCIES.—Mem6 bers shall be appointed for the life of the Commission. Any
7 vacancy in the Commission shall not affect its powers, but
8 shall be filled in the same manner as the original appoint9 ment.

(d) CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR.—The Commission shall
select a Chair and Vice Chair from among its members.
(e) Initial Meeting.--Not later than 30 days after the date
on which all members of the Commission have been appointed, the Commission shall hold its initial meeting.

(e) MEETINGS.—The Commission shall meet at the
call of the Chair. (g) Quorum.--A majority of the members
of the Commission shall constitute a quorum, but a lesser
number of members may hold hearings.

19 (f) DUTIES.—

20 (1) STUDY ON MILITARY AVIATION SAFETY.—
21 The Commission shall undertake a comprehensive
22 study of United States military aviation mishaps
23 that occurred between fiscal years 2013 and 2018 in
24 order—

1 (A) to assess the rates of military aviation 2 mishaps between fiscal years 2013 and 2018 compared to historic aviation mishap rates; 3 4 (B) to make an assessment of the causes contributing to military aviation mishaps; and 5 6 (C) to make recommendations on the 7 modifications, if any, of safety, training, main-8 tenance, personnel, or other policies related to 9 military aviation safety. 10 REPORT.—Not later than February 1, (2)11 2020, the Commission shall submit to the President 12 and the congressional defense committees a report 13 setting forth a detailed statement of the findings 14 and conclusions of the Commission as a result of the 15 study required by paragraph (1), together with the 16 recommendations of the Commission for such legisla-17 tive and administrative actions as the Commission 18 considers appropriate in light of the results of the 19 study. 20 (g) POWERS.— (1) HEARINGS.—The Commission may hold 21 22 such hearings, sit and act at such times and places, 23 take such testimony, and receive such evidence as 24 the Commission considers advisable to carry out its

25 duties under this subtitle.

1 (2) INFORMATION FROM DEPARTMENT.—The 2 Commission may secure directly from any element of 3 the Department of Defense such information as the 4 Commission considers necessary to carry out its du-5 ties under this subtitle. Upon request of the Chair 6 of the Commission, the head of such element shall 7 furnish such information to the Commission.

8 (h) TERMINATION.—The Commission shall terminate
9 90 days after the date on which the Commission submits
10 the report required under subsection (f)(2).

(i) FUNDING.—Amounts authorized to be appropriated for fiscal year 2019 by section 301 and available
for Operation and Maintenance for the Army, Air Force,
Navy, and Marine Corps, as specified in the funding table
in section 4301, may be available for the activities of the
Commission under this subtitle.

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
