IFA AHP/Tax Reform Survey Presentation June 27, 2018

## Key Points

When it comes to healthcare priorities, cost is paramount to all voters:

- Among registered voters, $89 \%$ say that the cost of healthcare is 'important' to their 2018 vote, while 72\% consider it 'very important.'
- Concern about healthcare cost among voters is consistent across political parties, with 91\% of Republicans, 90\% of Democrats, and 86\% of Independents calling it an 'important priority' for their 2018 vote.
- Repealing and replacing Obamacare ranks last in importance for both Democrats and Independents and third for Republicans.

Support for Association Health Plans (AHPs) is strong

- When given a blinded description of AHPs, $69 \%$ of voters support them while only 7\% oppose.
- Support remains high when AHPs are fully explained, with $56 \%$ of registered voters support and only $4 \%$
opposed.
- Over half of Democrats (55\%), Independents (54\%), and Republicans (61\%) support AHPs.


## All registered voters and political parties prefer a candidate who supports AHPs:

- The majority of registered voters (55\%) are more likely to support a candidate running for political office who supports Association Health Plans.
- This preference for pro-AHP candidates is steady among parties: $57 \%$ of Democrats, $54 \%$ of Republicans, 53\% of Independents
- In a generic head-to-head race between a pro-AHP candidate and an anti-AHP candidate, voters overwhelmingly choose the pro-AHP candidateincluding Democrats.

Methodology: This poll was conducted from June 05-06, 2018, among a national sample of 1990 Registered Voters. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Registered Voters based on age, race/ethnicity, gender, educational attainment, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.
