## Texas District 10 Voter Poll

August 2018

## Research Design

524 completed surveys were collected between July 31 and Aug 4, 2018 with registered voters in the 10th Congressional District of Texas.

Participants qualified for the poll by meeting the following criteria:

- 18 years of age or older
- Registered to vote
- Live in a District 10 zip code
- Live in a District 10 county
- Those who said they are definitely not in the $10^{\text {th }}$ District were removed
- 270 of the 524 completes came from consumers who are verified to live in District 10 by the sample source companies
- The margin of error is $4.3 \%$ at the $95 \%$ confidence level

The poll covered the following topics:

- Demographics (e.g. gender, race, age, education, etc.)
- Party preference and political viewpoint
- Likelihood to vote
- Importance of issues
- Familiarity with Siegel and McCaul
- Favorability of Siegel and McCaul (before candidate profile)
- Who they would vote for (before candidate profile)
- Scenarios impact on voting
- Favorability of Siegel and McCaul (after candidate profile)
- Who they would vote for (after candidate profile)


## Methodology

The raw distribution of completed surveys:

## County:

- 34\% Harris
- 33\% Travis
- 33\% Rural

Gender:

- $59 \%$ Female
- $41 \%$ Male

Age:

- $37 \%$ Under 45
- 34\% 45-64
- 29\% 65+

Political Party:

- $43 \%$ Republican
- 38\% Democrat
- 19\% Independent

Results are weighted to be representative of District 10:

County (Target 38\%/35\%/27\%):

- 39\% Harris
- $34 \%$ Travis
- $27 \%$ Rural

Gender (Target 52\%/48\%):

- $54 \%$ Female
- $46 \%$ Male

Age (Target 43\%/35\%/23\%):

- $40 \%$ Under 45
- $39 \% 45-64$
- $22 \% 65+$

Political Party (Target 45\%/39\%/16\%):

- $45 \%$ Republican
- $41 \%$ Democrat
- 14\% Independent
