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## 2018 Midterm Forecast Roundup: Week of Nov. 5


In their final updates before the midterm elections, forecasters say the state of the race is essentially unchanged over the past several weeks, with no late-breaking surge for either party.

In the House, the consensus among forecasters remains that Democrats have a definitive but not overwhelming lead.

The electoral battleground is large and lopsided — The Cook Political Report says 70 GOP-held districts are competitive, compared to just five held by Democrats. If Democrats outperform their polling in the House and win districts currently leaning GOP, they could potentially flip more than 40 seats in a classic wave election scenario.

Forecasters say Republicans are more likely to hold the Senate, with FiveThirtyEight's Nate Silver suggesting that Democrats would need to outperform their polls by an unusual amount to have any chance of winning a majority there.

Forecaster Larry Sabato argues that the results may look similar to 2016: Democrats can expect to make gains in highly educated suburbs that traditionally voted GOP before Trump came into office, while Republicans continue to run strong in blue collar and rural districts that flipped Republican in the most recent cycle.
