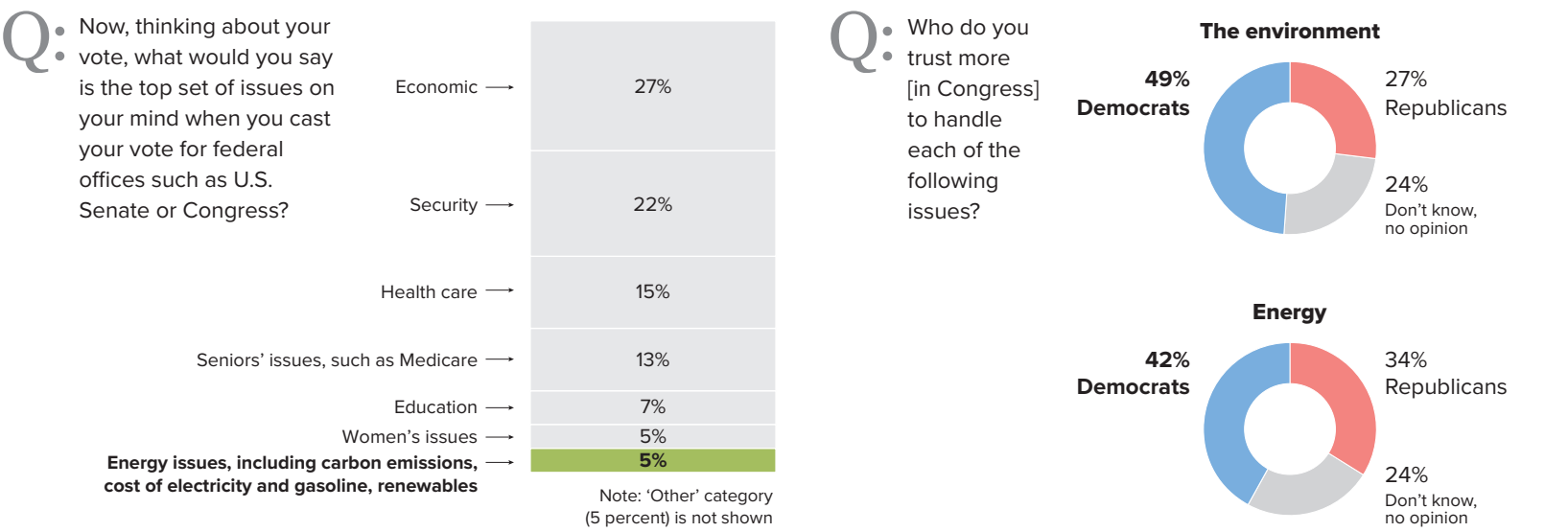


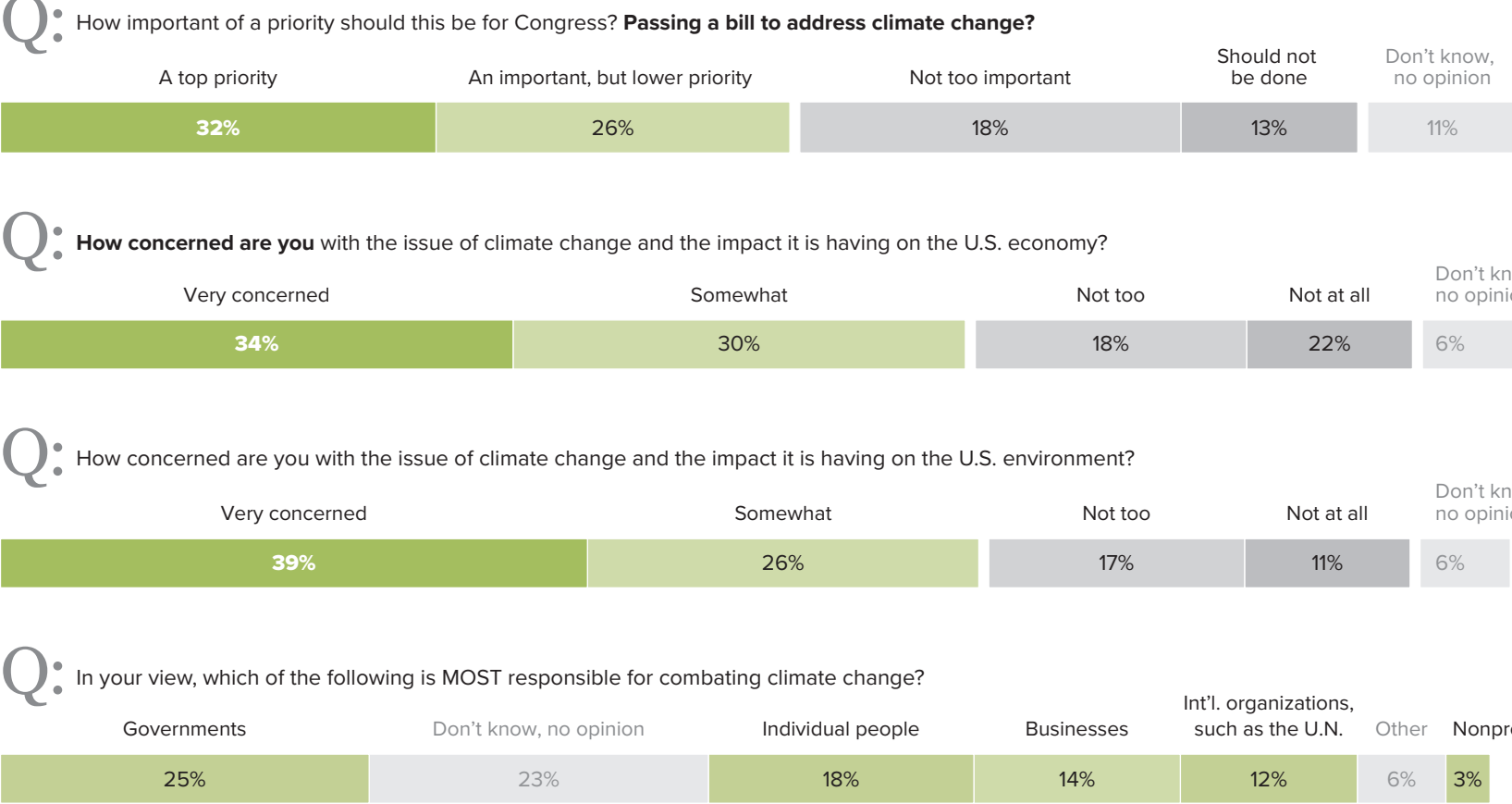

Majority of Voters Want Congress to Act on Climate Change

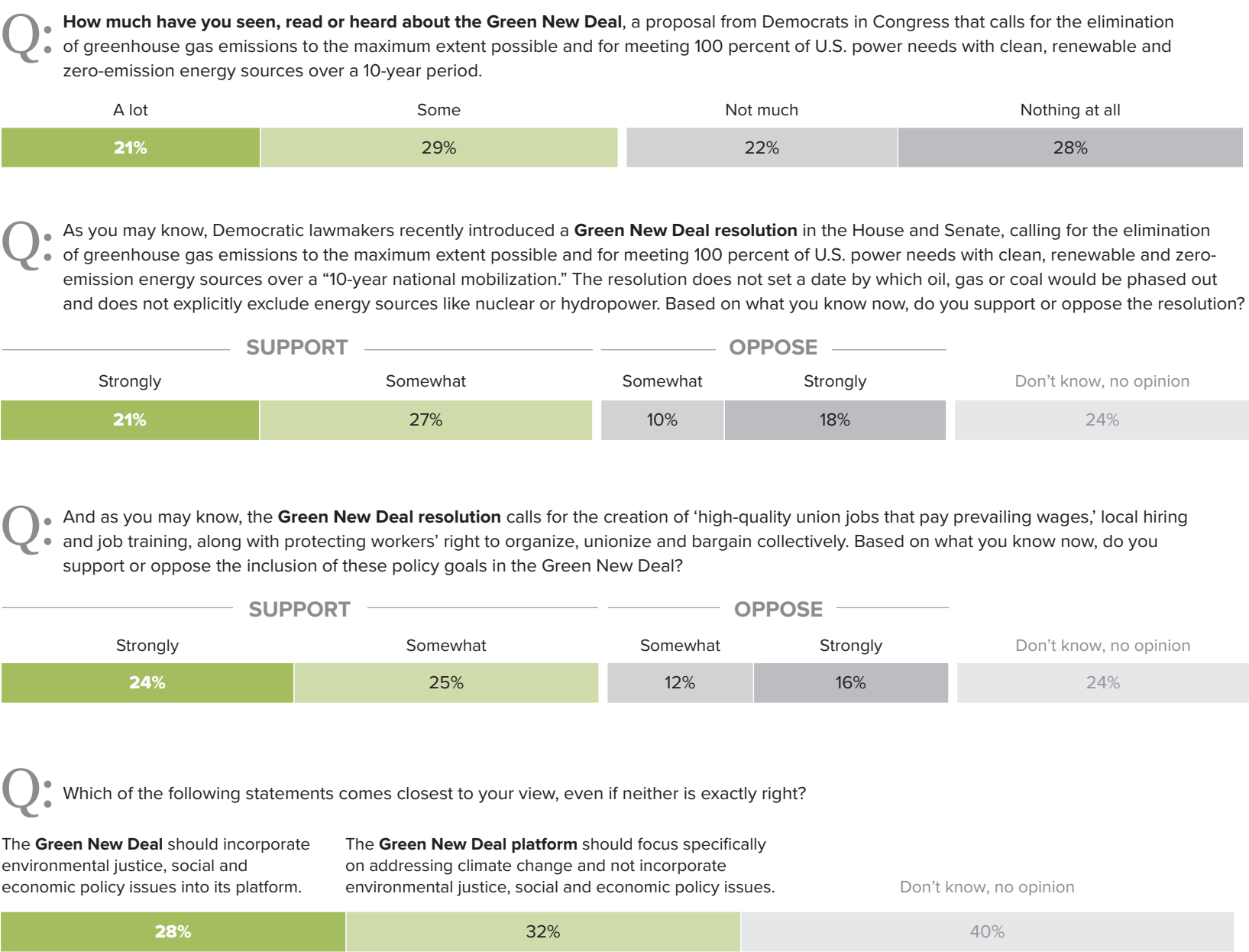
Although environmental issues are not a top priority, 58 percent of American voters think climate change is an important issue that Congress should address. Almost two-thirds are concerned about the impacts of climate change on the American economy and environment, and nearly half of voters support the Green New Deal, according to a mid-February Morning Consult-POLITICO poll.

The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of registered voters based on age, race/ethnicity, gender, educational attainment, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.
