8	until December 31, 2020, for necessary expenses related

12	canes, floods, tornadoes, typhoons, volcanic activity, snow-
13	storms, and wildfires occurring in calendar years 2018

15	by the Secretary: <i>Provided</i> , That the Secretary may pro-
16	vide assistance for such losses in the form of block grants
17	to eligible states and territories and such assistance may
18	include compensation to producers, as determined by the
19	Secretary, for forest restoration and poultry and livestock
20	losses: Provided further, That of the amounts provided
21	under this heading, tree assistance payments may be made
22	under section $1501(e)$ of the Agricultural Act of 2014 (7
23	U.S.C. 9081(e)) to eligible orchardists or nursery tree
24	growers (as defined in such section) of pecan trees with
25	a tree mortality rate that exceeds 7.5 percent (adjusted

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for normal mortality) and is less than 15 percent (ad-1 2 justed for normal mortality), to be available until ex-3 pended, for losses incurred during the period beginning 4 January 1, 2018, and ending December 31, 2018: Provided further, That in the case of producers impacted by 5 volcanic activity that resulted in the loss of crop land, or 6 7 access to crop land, the Secretary shall consider all meas-8 ures available, as appropriate, to bring replacement land 9 into production: *Provided further*, That the total amount 10 of payments received under this heading and applicable policies of crop insurance under the Federal Crop Insur-11 12 ance Act (7 U.S.C. 1501 et seq.) or the Noninsured Crop 13 Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) under section 196 of the Federal Agriculture Improvement and Reform Act of 14 15 1996 (7 U.S.C. 7333) shall not exceed 90 percent of the loss as determined by the Secretary: *Provided further*, 16 That the total amount of payments received under this 17 heading for producers who did not obtain a policy or plan 18 of insurance for an insurable commodity for the applicable 19 crop year under the Federal Crop Insurance Act (7 U.S.C. 20 21 1501 et seq.) for the crop incurring the losses or did not 22 file the required paperwork and pay the service fee by the 23 applicable State filing deadline for a noninsurable com-24 modity for the applicable crop year under NAP for the 25 crop incurring the losses shall not exceed 70 percent of

For an additional amount for "Watershed and Flood 6 7 Prevention Operations", for necessary expenses for the 8 Emergency Watershed Protection Program related to the 9 consequences of Hurricanes Michael and Florence and 10 wildfires occurring in calendar year 2018, and other natural disasters, \$125,000,000, to remain available until ex-11 12 pended: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the 13 Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and 14 15 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

8 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS TITLE

9 SEC. 101. In addition to amounts otherwise made 10 available, out of the funds made available under section 18 of Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, \$25,200,000 shall 11 12 be available for the Secretary to provide a grant to the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands for dis-13 14 aster nutrition assistance in response to the Presidentially 15 declared major disasters and emergencies: *Provided*, That funds made available to the Commonwealth of the North-16 17 ern Mariana Islands under this section shall remain avail-18 able for obligation by the Commonwealth until September 19 30, 2020: Provided further, That such amount is des-20ignated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-21 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-22 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985. 23 SEC. 102. For purposes of administering title I of

24 subdivision 1 of division B of the Bipartisan Budget Act
25 of 2018 (Public Law 115–123), losses to agricultural pro-

ducers resulting from hurricanes shall also include losses 1 incurred from Tropical Storm Cindy and losses of peach 2 3 and blueberry crops in calendar year 2017 due to extreme 4 cold: *Provided*, That the amounts provided by this section 5 are designated by the Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the 6 7 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 8 1985: Provided further, That amounts repurposed under 9 this heading that were previously designated by the Con-10 gress as an emergency requirement pursuant to the Bal-11 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 12 are designated by the Congress as an emergency require-13 ment pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985. 14

15 SEC. 103. (a)(1) Except as provided in paragraph 16 (2), a person or legal entity is not eligible to receive a 17 payment under the Market Facilitation Program estab-18 lished pursuant to the Commodity Credit Corporation 19 Charter Act (15 U.S.C. 714 et seq.) if the average ad-20 justed gross income of such person or legal entity is great-21 er than \$900,000.

(2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply to a person or legal
entity if at least 75 percent of the adjusted gross income
of such person or legal entity is derived from farming,
ranching, or forestry related activities.

(b) A person or legal entity may not receive a pay ment under the Market Facilitation Program described in
 subsection (a)(1), directly or indirectly, of more than
 \$125,000.

In addition to other amounts made avail-14 able by section 309 of division A of the Additional Supple-15 mental Appropriations for Disaster Relief Requirements Act, 2017 (Public Law 115–72; 131 Stat. 1229), there 16 is appropriated to the Secretary, out of any moneys in the 17 18 Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the fiscal year 19 ending September 30, 2019, \$600,000,000 to provide a grant to the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico for disaster 20 21 nutrition assistance in response to a major disaster or 22 emergency designated by the President under the Robert 23 T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act 24 (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.): *Provided*, That the funds made available to the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico under this 25

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section shall remain available for obligation by the Com monwealth until September 30, 2020, and shall be in addi tion to funds otherwise made available: *Provided further*,
 That such amount is designated by the Congress as being
 for an emergency requirement pursuant to section
 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
 Deficit Control Act of 1985 (2 U.S.C. 901(b)(2)(A)(i)).

8 SEC. 105. There is hereby appropriated \$5,000,000, 9 to remain available until September 30, 2020, for the Sec-10 retary of Agriculture to conduct an independent study, including a survey of participants, to compare the impact 11 12 of the additional benefits provided by section 309 of Public 13 Law 115–72 to the food insecurity, health status, and well-being of low-income residents in Puerto Rico without 14 15 such additional benefits: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-16 17 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-18 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

16 PAYMENT TO THE LEGAL SERVICES CORPORATION

17 For an additional amount for "Payment to the Legal 18 Services Corporation" to carry out the purposes of the Legal Services Corporation Act by providing for necessary 19 20 expenses related to the consequences of Hurricanes Flor-21 ence, Michael, and Lane, Typhoons Yutu and Mangkhut, 22 calendar year 2018 wildfires, volcanic eruptions, and 23 earthquakes, and calendar year 2019 tornadoes and 24 floods, \$15,000,000: Provided, That such amount is des-25 ignated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-

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quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-1 2 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985: 3 *Provided further*, That none of the funds appropriated in 4 this Act to the Legal Services Corporation shall be ex-5 pended for any purpose prohibited or limited by, or contrary to any of the provisions of, sections 501, 502, 503, 6 7 504, 505, and 506 of Public Law 105–119, and all funds 8 appropriated in this Act to the Legal Services Corporation 9 shall be subject to the same terms and conditions set forth 10 in such sections, except that all references in sections 502 11 and 503 to 1997 and 1998 shall be deemed to refer in-12 stead to 2018 and 2019, respectively, and except that sections 501 and 503 of Public Law 104–134 (referenced by 13 14 Public Law 105–119) shall not apply to the amount made 15 available under this heading: *Provided further*, That, for the purposes of this Act, the Legal Services Corporation 16 17 shall be considered an agency of the United States Gov-18 ernment.

5 For an additional amount for "Investigations" for necessary expenses related to the completion, or initiation 6 7 and completion, of flood and storm damage reduction, in-8 cluding shore protection, studies which are currently au-9 thorized or which are authorized after the date of enact-10 ment of this Act, to reduce risk from future floods and hurricanes, at full Federal expense, \$35,000,000, to re-11 12 main available until expended, for high priority studies of 13 projects in States and insular areas that were impacted by Hurricanes Florence and Michael, Typhoon Mangkhut, 14 15 Super Typhoon Yutu, and Tropical Storm Gita: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress as being 16 17 for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 18 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985: Provided further, That the 19 Assistant Secretary of the Army for Civil Works shall pro-20 21 vide a monthly report directly to the Committees on Ap-22 propriations of the House and the Senate detailing the al-23 location and obligation of these funds, including new stud-24 ies selected to be initiated using funds provided under this

1 heading, beginning not later than 60 days after the date2 of enactment of this Act.

CONSTRUCTION

4 For an additional amount for "Construction" for nec-5 essary expenses, \$740,000,000, to remain available until expended, to construct flood and storm damage reduction, 6 7 including shore protection, projects which are currently 8 authorized or which are authorized after the date of enact-9 ment of this Act, and flood and storm damage reduction, 10 including shore protection, projects which have signed Chief's Reports as of the date of enactment of this Act 11 or which are studied using funds provided under the head-12 ing "Investigations" if the Secretary determines such 13 projects to be technically feasible, economically justified, 14 15 and environmentally acceptable, in States and insular areas that were impacted by Hurricanes Florence and Mi-16 17 chael, Typhoon Mangkhut, Super Typhoon Yutu, and 18 Tropical Storm Gita: *Provided*, That projects receiving funds provided under the first proviso in "Title IV—Corps 19 of Engineers—Civil—Department of the Army—Con-20 21 struction" in Public Law 115–123 shall not be eligible for 22 funding provided under this heading: Provided further, 23 That for projects receiving funds provided under this 24 heading, the provisions of Section 902 of the Water Re-25 sources Development Act of 1986 shall not apply to these

10 For an additional amount for "Mississippi River and 11 Tributaries" for necessary expenses to address emergency 12 situations at Corps of Engineers projects and rehabilitate 13 and repair damages to Corps of Engineers projects, caused by natural disasters, including disasters in 2019, 14 15 \$575,000,000, to remain available until expended: Pro*vided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress 16 17 as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to sec-18 tion 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-19 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985: Provided further, That the Assistant Secretary of the Army for Civil Works shall 20 21 provide a monthly report directly to the Committees on 22 Appropriations of the House of Representatives and the 23 Senate detailing the allocation and obligation of these 24 funds, beginning not later than 60 days after the date of enactment of this Act. 25

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OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

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under this heading shall not be considered relevant to the 1 2 non-disaster formula allocations made pursuant to section 3 106 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 4 1974 (42 U.S.C. 5306): Provided further, That a State, unit of general local government, or Indian tribe may use 5 up to 5 percent of its allocation for administrative costs: 6 Provided further, That the first proviso under this heading 7 8 in the Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief 9 Requirements Act, 2018 (division I of Public Law 115– 254) is amended by striking "State or unit of general local 10 11 government" and inserting "State, unit of general local 12 government, or Indian tribe (as such term is defined in 13 section 102 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 5302))": Provided further, That 14 15 the sixth proviso under this heading in the Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief Requirements Act, 16 17 2018 (division I of Public Law 115–254) is amended by striking "State or subdivision thereof" and inserting 18 19 "State, unit of general local government, or Indian tribe 20 (as such term is defined in section 102 of the Housing 21 and Community Development Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 22 5302))": Provided further, That in administering the 23 funds under this heading, the Secretary of Housing and 24Urban Development may waive, or specify alternative re-25 quirements for, any provision of any statute or regulation

that the Secretary administers in connection with the obli-1 2 gation by the Secretary or the use by the recipient of these 3 funds (except for requirements related to fair housing, 4 nondiscrimination, labor standards, and the environment), if the Secretary finds that good cause exists for the waiver 5 or alternative requirement and such waiver or alternative 6 7 requirement would not be inconsistent with the overall 8 purpose of title I of the Housing and Community Develop-9 ment Act of 1974: Provided further, That, notwithstanding the preceding proviso, recipients of funds provided under 10 11 this heading that use such funds to supplement Federal 12 assistance provided under section 402, 403, 404, 406, 13 407, 408 (c)(4), or 502 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster 14 Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et 15 seq.) may adopt, without review or public comment, any 16 environmental review, approval, or permit performed by 17 a Federal agency, and such adoption shall satisfy the re-18 sponsibilities of the recipient with respect to such environ-19 mental review, approval or permit: *Provided further*, That, 20notwithstanding section 104(g)(2) of the Housing and 21 Community Development Act of 1974 (42) U.S.C. 22 5304(g)(2)), the Secretary may, upon receipt of a request 23 for release of funds and certification, immediately approve 24 the release of funds for an activity or project assisted under this heading if the recipient has adopted an environ-25

mental review, approval or permit under the preceding 1 proviso or the activity or project is categorically excluded 2 3 from review under the National Environmental Policy Act 4 of 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4321 et seq.): Provided further, That 5 the Secretary shall publish via notice in the Federal Register any waiver, or alternative requirement, to any statute 6 7 or regulation that the Secretary administers pursuant to 8 title I of the Housing and Community Development Act 9 of 1974 no later than 5 days before the effective date of 10 such waiver or alternative requirement: *Provided further*, 11 That of the amounts made available under this heading, 12 up to \$5,000,000 shall be made available for capacity 13 building and technical assistance, including assistance on 14 contracting and procurement processes, to support States, units of general local government, or Indian tribes (and 15 their subrecipients) that receive allocations pursuant to 16 17 this heading, received disaster recovery allocations under the same heading in Public Law 115–254, or may receive 18 similar allocations for disaster recovery in future appro-19 priations Acts: *Provided further*, That of the amounts 20 21 made available under this heading and under the same 22 heading in Public Law 115–254, up to \$2,500,000 shall 23 be transferred, in aggregate, to "Department of Housing" 24 and Urban Development—Program Office Salaries and Expenses—Community Planning and Development" for 25

necessary costs, including information technology costs, of 1 2 administering and overseeing the obligation and expendi-3 ture of amounts under this heading: *Provided further*, 4 That the amount specified in the preceding proviso shall 5 be combined with funds appropriated under the same heading and for the same purpose in Public Law 115– 6 7 254 and the aggregate of such amounts shall be available 8 for any of the same such purposes specified under this 9 heading or the same heading in Public Law 115–254 with-10 out limitation: *Provided further*, That such amount is designated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-11 12 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-13 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985: *Provided further*, That amounts repurposed under this 14 15 heading that were previously designated by the Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to the Balanced 16 Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act are designated 17 by the Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant 18 19 to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and 20 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

21 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS TITLE

SEC. 1001. (a) Amounts previously made available
for activities authorized under title I of the Housing and
Community Development Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 5301 et
seq.) related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, restora-

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tion of infrastructure and housing, economic revitalization, 1 2 and mitigation in the most impacted and distressed areas 3 resulting from a major disaster, including funds provided 4 under section 145 of division C of Public Law 114–223, 5 section 192 of division C of Public Law 114–223 (as added by section 101(3) of division A of Public Law 114– 6 7 254), section 421 of division K of Public Law 115–31, 8 and any mitigation funding provided under the heading 9 "Department of Housing and Urban Development—Com-10 munity Planning and Development—Community Development Fund" of Public Law 115–123, that were allocated 11 in response to Hurricane Matthew, may be used inter-12 13 changeably and without limitation for the same activities in the most impacted and distressed areas related to Hur-14 15 ricane Florence. In addition, any funds provided under the heading "Department of Housing and Urban Develop-16 ment—Community Planning and Development—Commu-17 nity Development Fund" in this Act or in division I of 18 Public Law 115–254 that are allocated in response to 19 Hurricane Florence may be used interchangeably and 20without limitation for the same activities in the most im-21 22 pacted and distressed areas related to Hurricane Matthew. 23 Until HUD publishes the Federal Register Notice imple-24 menting this provision, grantees may submit for HUD ap-25 proval revised plans for the use of funds related to Hurri-

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cane Matthew that expand the eligible beneficiaries of ex-1 isting programs contained in such previously approved 2 3 plans to include those impacted by Hurricane Florence. 4 Approval of any such revised plans shall include the execu-5 tion of revised grant terms and conditions as necessary. Once the implementing Notice is published, any additional 6 7 action plan revisions shall follow the requirements con-8 tained therein.

9 (b) Amounts made available for administrative costs 10 for activities authorized under title I of the Housing and 11 Community Development Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 5301 et 12 seq.) related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, restora-13 tion of infrastructure and housing, economic revitalization, and mitigation in the most impacted and distressed areas 14 15 under this Act or any future Act, and amounts previously provided under section 420 of division L of Public Law 16 114–113, section 145 of division C of Public Law 114– 17 18 223, section 192 of division C of Public Law 114–223 (as 19 added by section 101(3) of division A of Public Law 114– 20 254), section 421 of division K of Public Law 115–31, 21 and under the heading "Department of Housing and 22 Urban Development—Community Planning and Develop-23 ment—Community Development Fund" of division B of 24 Public Law 115–56, Public Law 115–123, and Public 25 Law 115–254, shall be available for eligible administrative

costs of the grantee related to any disaster relief funding
 identified in this subsection without regard to the par ticular disaster appropriation from which such funds origi nated.

5 (c) The additional uses pursuant to this section for amounts that were previously designated by the Congress, 6 7 respectively, as an emergency requirement or as being for 8 disaster relief pursuant to the Balanced Budget and 9 Emergency Deficit Control Act are designated by the Con-10 gress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and 11 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 or as being for 12 13 disaster relief pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(D) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 14 15 1985.

16 SEC. 1002. Of all amounts made available for mitigation activities under the heading "Department of Housing 17 18 Urban Development—Community Development and Fund" in Public Law 115–123, the Secretary shall publish 19 20 in the Federal Register the allocations to all eligible grant-21 ees, and the necessary administrative requirements appli-22 cable to such allocations within 90 days after enactment 23 of this Act;

24 (1) For any plans or amendments addressing25 the use of any funds provided under Public Law

115-123 and received by the Secretary prior to De cember 22, 2018, the Secretary shall review pending
 amendments within 15 days of enactment of this Act
 and pending plans within 30 days of enactment of
 this Act;

6 (2) After the date of this Act, the Secretary 7 may not apply the statutory waiver or alternative re-8 quirement authority provided by Public Law 115– 9 123 to extend or otherwise alter existing statutory 10 and regulatory provisions governing the timeline for 11 review of required grantee plans.

TITLE XI

GENERAL PROVISION—THIS ACT

3 SEC. 1101. Each amount designated in this Act by 4 the Congress as being for an emergency requirement pur-5 suant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget 6 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 shall be avail-7 able (or rescinded or transferred, if applicable) only if the 8 President subsequently so designates all such amounts 9 and transmits such designations to the Congress.

10 This Act may be cited as the "Additional Supple-11 mental Appropriations for Disaster Relief Act, 2019".
