Dear Ranking Member Udall:

Thank you for your June 7, 2018, letter requesting that the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA's) Office of Inspector General (OIG) review whether former EPA Administrator Scott Pruitt used his position to pursue business opportunities to benefit himself and his family. You specifically noted reports that Mr. Pruitt discussed business opportunities for his wife with Chick-Fil-A and Concordia executives.

Relating to your request, the OIG opened an investigation into whether Mr. Pruitt used his official position and staff to seek business opportunities for his wife with Chick-fil-A and Concordia. The OIG investigation included interviewing witnesses, collecting and reviewing records, and coordinating with the U.S. Office of Government Ethics.

However, Mr. Pruitt's resignation on July 6, 2018, before the investigation concluded, precluded his ever being subject to disciplinary action. The EPA OIG's Semiannual Report to Congress published on November 30, 2018, explained that, for this reason, the investigation was deemed inconclusive and would be closed. The case now officially has been closed, and my office is taking no further action related to the matter.
