4 (a) DESIGNATION AS HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES.—

5 Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment of this

6 Act, the Administrator of the Environmental Protection

7 Agency shall designate all per- and polyfluoroalkyl sub-

8 stances as hazardous substances under section 102(a) of

1 the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensa-
2 tion, and Liability Act of 1980 (42 U.S.C. 9602(a)).

3 (b) AIRPORT SPONSORS.—No sponsor (as defined in
4 section 47102 of title 49, United States Code), including
5 a sponsor of the civilian portion of a joint-use airport or
6 a shared-use airport (as those terms are defined in section
7 139.5 of title 14, Code of Federal Regulations (or suc-
8 cessor regulations)), shall be liable under the Comprehen-
9 sive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liabil-
10 ity Act of 1980 (42 U.S.C. 9601 et seq.) for the costs
11 of responding to, or damages from, releases to the environ-
12 ment of per- or polyfluoroalkyl substances that resulted
13 from the use of aqueous film-forming foam, if that use
14 was required pursuant to, and carried out in accordance
15 with, part 139 of title 14, Code of Federal Regulations
16 (as in effect on the date of enactment of this Act).
