To provide a definition of navigable waters, and for other purposes.
1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4 This Act may be cited as the "Define WOTUS Act
5 of 2019".
6 SEC. 2. WATERS OF THE UNITED STATES AND NAVIGABLE
7 WATERS.
8 (a) Waters of the United States Rule Re-
9 PEAL.—The final rule issued by the Administrator of the

10 Environmental Protection Agency and the Secretary of the

11 Army entitled "Clean Water Rule: Definition of Waters

1	of the United States'" (80 Fed. Reg. 37054 (June 29,
2	2015)) is void.
3	(b) Navigable Waters Definition.—Section 502
4	of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C.
5	1362) is amended by striking paragraph (7) and inserting
6	the following:
7	"(7) Navigable waters.—
8	"(A) In General.—The term 'navigable
9	waters' means—
10	"(i) the territorial seas;
11	"(ii) interstate waters that are used,
12	or are susceptible to use in the natural and
13	ordinary condition of those waters, as a
14	means in transport of interstate or foreign
15	commerce;
16	"(iii) relatively permanent, standing,
17	or continuously flowing bodies of water
18	that form geographical features commonly
19	known as streams, rivers, or lakes, that
20	flow directly into waters described in
21	clause (ii); and
22	"(iv) wetlands that are adjacent to
23	and have a continuous surface water con-
24	nection to waters described in clause (ii) or
25	(iii).

1	"(B) Exclusions.—The term 'navigable
2	waters' does not include—
3	"(i) intermittent or ephemeral waters,
4	including features that flow only in re-
5	sponse to precipitation or melt from
6	snowpack;
7	"(ii) subsurface waters, such as
8	groundwater or underground streams, in-
9	cluding subsurface waters drained through
10	subsurface drainage systems, such as drain
11	tiling;
12	"(iii) intrastate waters, unless the
13	waters meet the requirements described in
14	subparagraph (A);
15	"(iv) a man-made channel or ditch,
16	including irrigation, distribution, and
17	drainage systems;
18	"(v) prior converted cropland;
19	"(vi) artificially irrigated areas;
20	"(vii) artificial lakes and ponds con-
21	structed in upland;
22	"(viii) water-filled depressions created
23	in upland, including water-filled depres-
24	sions incidental to mining or construction
25	activity;

1	"(ix) stormwater control features ex-
2	cavated or constructed in upland to convey,
3	treat, infiltrate, or store stormwater run-
4	off;
5	"(x) wastewater recycling structures
6	constructed in upland;
7	"(xi) waste treatment systems;
8	"(xii) waters that require the use of
9	means beyond visual inspection by the
10	naked eye, including aerial photographs,
11	satellite imaging, or hydrological testing, to
12	determine if the waters meets the require-
13	ments described in subparagraph (A); or
14	"(xiii) any other waters that do not
15	meet the requirements under subparagraph
16	(A), without regard to whether the water—
17	"(I) previously met or would have
18	met those requirements; or
19	"(II) may in the future meet
20	those requirements.
21	"(C) Associated definitions.—For the
22	purposes of this paragraph:
23	"(i) Continuous surface water
24	CONNECTION.—The term 'continuous sur-
25	face water connection' means a connection

1	with respect to which an ordinary person
2	would not be able to visually determine by
3	the naked eye, by looking at the water sur
4	face, where 1 body of water ends and the
5	other begins.
6	"(ii) Relatively permanent
7	STANDING, OR CONTINUOUSLY FLOWING
8	BODIES OF WATER.—The term 'relatively
9	permanent, standing, or continuously flow
10	ing bodies of water' means waters that, ex
11	cept in cases of extreme events (such as a
12	drought)—
13	"(I) stand or have continuous
14	flow for not less than 185 days each
15	year; and
16	"(II) exhibit a bed and banks."
17	(c) Jurisdictional Determination.—Title V of
18	the Federal Water Pollution Control Act is amended—
19	(1) by redesignating section 520 (33 U.S.C
20	1251 note) as section 521; and
21	(2) by inserting after section 519 (33 U.S.C
22	1377a) the following:
23	"SEC. 520. JURISDICTIONAL DETERMINATIONS.
24	"(a) Definitions.—In this section:

1	"(1) Affected Person.—The term 'affected
2	person' means an applicant for a permit under sec-
3	tion 404, landowner, or other affected person with
4	an identifiable and substantial legal interest in a
5	property.
6	"(2) Secretary.—The term 'Secretary' means
7	the Secretary of the Army.
8	"(b) BINDING DETERMINATION.—On written request
9	of an affected person, the Secretary shall provide a bind-
10	ing determination of whether the waters on the property
11	of the affected person are navigable waters that meet the
12	requirements described in section $502(7)(A)(iv)$.
13	"(c) Costs.—A determination of the Secretary under
14	subsection (b) shall be made at the cost of the Secretary.
15	"(d) TIMING.—
16	"(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall make a
17	determination under subsection (b) not later than 60
18	days after the date on which the Secretary receives
19	a written request from an affected person.
20	"(2) Effect of nonresponse.—If the Sec-
21	retary does not make a determination by the end of
22	the period described in paragraph (1), the waters on
23	the property of the affected person shall not be con-
24	sidered to be navigable waters.
25	"(e) Term of Determination.—

1	"(1) FINDING OF NAVIGABLE WATERS.—If the
2	Secretary determines under subsection (b) that the
3	waters on the property of the affected person are
4	navigable waters, the determination shall be binding
5	on the Secretary and the Administrator for a period
6	to be determined by the Secretary, but in any case
7	not longer than 5 years after the date of the deter-
8	mination.
9	"(2) Finding of nonnavigable waters.—If
10	the Secretary determines under subsection (b) that
11	the waters on the property of the affected person are
12	not navigable waters, the determination shall be
13	binding on the Secretary and the Administrator for
14	as long as the affected person has an identifiable
15	and substantial legal interest in the property.
16	"(f) Judicial Review.—
17	"(1) IN GENERAL.—An affected person may ob-
18	tain expedited judicial review of a determination of
19	the Secretary under subsection (b).
20	"(2) Timing.—To obtain expedited judicial re-
21	view under paragraph (1), the affected person shall
22	submit a claim under that paragraph not later than
23	30 days after the date on which the Secretary makes
24	the determination under subsection (b).

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1 "(3) JURISDICTION.—A district court of the
2 United States with appropriate venue for the State
3 in which the affected person resides or in which a
4 substantial part of the property of the affected per5 son is located shall have jurisdiction over an action
6 under this subsection.".
