## Land use emissions ebb with forest conservation

Net greenhouse gas emissions from human use of forest lands have fallen more than 40 percent since 1995, according to data from the UN's Food and Agriculture Organization. Conserving forests can enhance their role as carbon sinks while helping prevent greenhouse gas emissions from deforestation. Should countries follow through with pledges of "nationally determined contributions" under the Paris agreement, scientists project that forest conservation could provide as much as a quarter of planned emissions reductions.
