



## More than half of the U.S. is still committed to the Paris agreement

Despite Trump administration plans to abandon the Paris climate agreement, a coalition of U.S. states, cities, counties, institutions and businesses are determined to meet the agreement's goals set by the Obama administration. According to America's Pledge on Climate Change, the group represents 51 percent of U.S. emissions, 65 percent of the U.S. population and 68 percent of the national GDP. America's Pledge on Climate Change projects that ambitious coalition action could reduce greenhouse gases as much as 37 percent below 2005 levels by 2030. With "aggressive federal engagement," that reduction number could reach 49 percent below 2005 levels.
