# Tracking toss-up Congressional races

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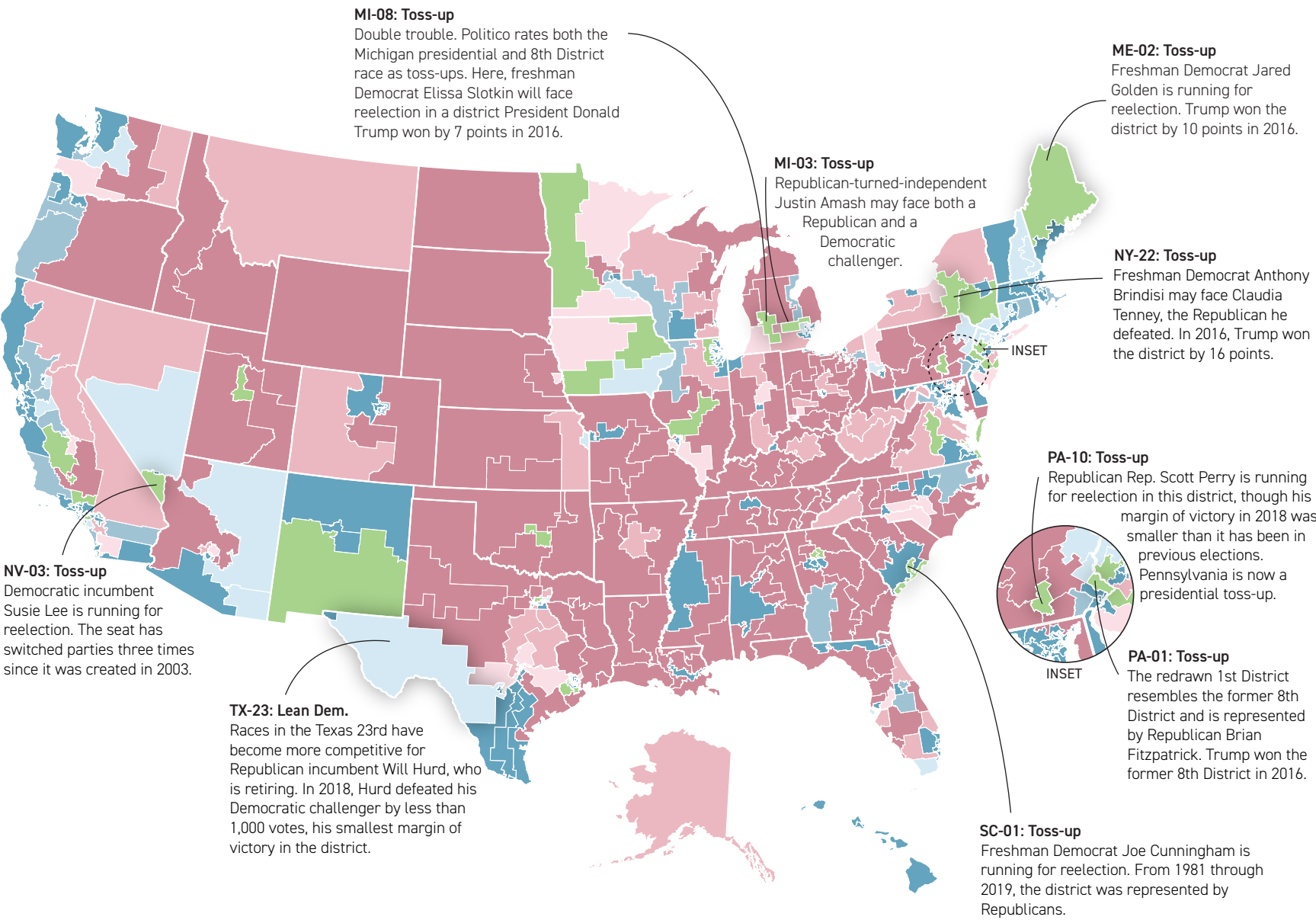
The entire House and one-third of the Senate will be elected on Nov. 3, 2020. As of Jan. 28, 2020, POLITICO rates 31 House races and three Senate races as toss-ups. Five tossup House races are in states considered toss-ups in the presidential elections. Remaining House toss-up races may be easier for Democratic candidates to win than for Republican candidates.

## Presidential election could swing toss-up House races

POLITICO rates 31 House races as toss-ups. Turnout for the presidential election could be particularly important in determining these races. Success for Democratic candidates may be tied to a successful Democratic presidential campaign: 16 toss-up House races are set for states that are likelier to go for the Democratic presidential candidate. Five House toss-up races are in states that POLITICO also rates as toss-ups in the presidential election: Michigan, Nevada and Pennsylvania.

## POLITICO ratings for Senate races favor Republicans

POLITICO rates three Senate races as tossups: Colorado, North Carolina and the special election in Arizona to fill the late Sen. John McCain's seat. For the remaining 32 seats, 21 favor Republicans.
