(Public Law 116–92) of PFOS or PFOA contamination
from Department of Defense or National Guard activities
found in drinking water or in groundwater that is not cur-
rently used for drinking water, the Secretary of Defense
shall ensure that such actions result in a level that meets
or exceeds the most stringent of the following standards
for PFOS or PFOA in any environmental media:
(1) An enforceable State standard, in effect in
that State, for drinking, surface, or ground water, as
described in section $121(d)(2)(A)(ii)$ of the Com-
prehensive Environmental Response, Compensation,
