Re: FY 2022 Appropriations

Dear Majority Leader Schumer, Minority Leader McConnell, Speaker Pelosi, and Minority Leader McCarthy:

On behalf of the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HACU) and the 88 undersigned Hispanic-Serving Institutions (HSIs) and Emerging HSIs, we urge you to quickly enact fiscal year 2022 funding, as it relates to education and HSIs. The number of HSIs continues to grow, increasing from 311 in 2010 to 569 in 2019. As a group, HSIs play a critical role in educating a diverse pool of students. They enroll two-thirds of the estimated 3.8 million Hispanic college students in American higher education, many of whom are first-generation college students and come from low-income families.

Additionally, while HSIs account for 17% of all colleges and universities, they enroll 33% of Pell recipients in the United States. As the nation looks to rebuild the economy after the COVID-19 pandemic, it is critical that existing federal investments strengthen our workforce by enhancing the educational infrastructure of HSIs to pave a path of success and opportunity for students they educate and serve.

For decades, HSIs have been historically underfunded and underserved. In the last four months of this fiscal year, HSIs and their 5.24 million students have endured undue hardship due to the pandemic. In a time when the budget is currently operating on temporary funding, frozen at levels that were created by the previous administration and inadequate to meet the needs of institutions and their students, this inadequacy in funding further exacerbates the inequity that has existed for far too long.

The House-passed FY22 appropriations bill tries to address this inequity in funding by investing \$236.7 million in Title V, Part A and \$28.8 million in Title V, Part B. It also includes \$20 million for the HSIs education grants program under the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

The House bill also increases the Pell grant amount to \$400 and allows Dreamers and students with temporary protected status to be eligible. The Pell grant has not kept up with the rising cost of college. Congress needs to make the necessary investments to restore the purchasing power of the Pell and allow for the full coverage of college costs, including books and rent.
