Narrative:												
On 07/18/2022, Sgt. Manderano, PO O'Keefe, PO Carpenter, and myself were detailed to 55 Meadowlands Parkway (Hudson Regional Hospital) on a report of an unknown party calling EMS dispatch about a "bomb in the building."												
Upon arrival, PO Carpenter secured the main entrance to the hospital, while PO O'Keefe and myself went up to the fourth floor of the hospital to speak with EMS dispatch. As PO Carpenter secured the main entrance, EMS advised that they were re-directing all ambulances to other hospitals. PO Genatt was ordered to close off the Emergency room entrance as well.

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We met with EMS Chief Brigdon Campbell and EMS Dispatcher Vanessa Valdez. EMT Valdez stated that she received a call from 908-339-6908 on their non-emergency number (201-392-3300).

EMT Valdez further stated the caller sounded like a female voice recording and stated about four times that there was a bomb in the building. Afterwards, the caller hung up, which is when this agency was notified of the incident. It should be noted that due to the fact that the non-emergency number was contacted, the call was not recorded.

PO O'Keefe then requested for headquarters to do a search of our in-house records for the phone number, which yielded negative results. Afterwards, an accurint search for the phone number returned to an active landline belonging to a Robert Lee Solomon with a last known address of 19 [REDACTED]

At this time Sgt. Manderano was advised by the police desk that a Shoprite in Hoboken NJ received the same threat and they were currently investigating.

Furthermore, Kristal Lopez, the Quality Director of the hospital, found within the hospital in-house records a Robert Solomon with a last known address of 121 Lyons Ave., Newark, NJ 07112. She advised that this Robert Solomon only responded to a pop-up testing site during the height at the COVID-19 pandemic and never responded to the actual hospital. It was determined that he was not the same Robert Solomon who had the active landline (908-339-6908) out of New York. It should also be noted that an in house check was also negative for anyone with that name or phone number. Hospital staff that they can not recall anyone recently that left the hospital that appeared to be angry enough to make such a threat.

Vanessa Sanchez, the Human Resources Generalist for the hospital, was able to confirm that no current or former employee had that name or telephone number.

Shortly after Lt. Simone arrived on scene to establish incident command and requested for PO Minervini, PO Restrepo, PO Genatt, and PO Rodriguez to block the remaning entrances to the hospital. PO Minervini blocked the entrance by the ramp with car #50. PO Restrepo blocked the main entrance by Cove Court with car #37. PO Genatt blocked the emergency room entrance with car #39. PO Rodriguez blocked the entrance by the loading dock with car #35.

The Secaucus Fire Department responded to the scene as well, with Engine 1, Engine 3, Tower 2, and Rescue 1 standing by 45 Meadowlands Parkway (Union Beer) until further notice.

Lt. Simone then requested for Hudson County Sheriff's as well as Bayonne Police for available K9s to conduct a bomb sweep. Headquarters spoke with HCSO Lt. Zachorowski and Bayonne Sgt. McGillis who advised that their available K9 units were en-route to the hospital.

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Upon arrival of the K9 units, Lt. Simone was advised by Security Director Ollie White they would not be evacuating at this time but the K9s would be allowed to search common areas of hospital.

HCSO K9 Handler Lennon with his partner K9 Ranger as well as HCSO K9 Handler Tarazona with his partner K9 Tyson searched the 1st, the 2nd, the 3rd, and the 4th floors of the hospital, which yielded negative results.

HCSO K9 Handler Tarazona and K9 Tyson along with HCSO Conti conducted a sweep of the penthouse of the hospital. Head of Security Ollie White and Secretary [REDACTED] opened the door to Reuven Alon Alayoff's office, who is the Vice President of Strategic Alliances and Partnerships of the hospital. When HCSO K9 Handler Tarazona and K9 Tyson entered the room the K9 had a positive indication on an open closet door. Upon opening the closet door, it contained multiple rifles, handguns, and ammunition boxes.

Sgt. Manderano and PO O'Keefe were then escorted by HSCO Conti to Mr. Alon Alayoff's office to secure the area. Det. Fuardo was notified of this.

[REDACTED] advised us the main door to the office is usually locked but many persons do have access to the office. The closet containing the weapons can not be locked as the staff of the penthouse do not have a key.

Det. Fuardo arrived on scene. See Det. Fuardo's supplemental report for further information.

All appropriate personal were notified of this incident by Lt. Simone.

Narrative:	
On July 18, 2022, I was recalled to duty in furtherance of this investigation. Enroute, I was advised Bayonne Police K-9 Ranger gave positive indication to a closet within an office on the Penthouse floor. Officers reportedly opened the unlocked closet based upon the positive indication of the trained explosive K9 in reaction to a bomb threat fearing for the safety of themselves as well as the other occupants of the building.

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Case Number

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Upon opening the closet, officers immediately noticed a cache of long guns as multiple firearm barrels and stocks were visible along with a clear container containing a large quantity of ammunition in various calibers. This closet also contained various bags, boxes, and containers of different sizes.

Shortly thereafter I arrived on scene and met with Lieutenant Simone and Sergeant Manderano. After being briefed I contacted AP Ahmed Metwally expressing the exigency of the situation and seeking legal guidance on searching the closet for a potential explosive. It should be known, detection K-9's are only trained to alert on specific imprinted odors. The possibility existed the K-9 alerted due to the presence of ammunition of fired weapons. However, without searching the contents of the closet there was no other way to rule out the possibility of an explosive. An application for a search warrant of the closet would have caused a substantial delay potentially causing an unnecessary risk to public safety.

With the guidance of AP Metwally, Lieutenant Simone, Sergeant Manderano, Officer O'Keefe, Officer Munive, and I donned powder free nitrile examination gloves and removed all the bags and items from within the closet, placed them on a nearby table and searched the contents of each container and bag. No explosive devices were located. However, (11) handguns of various types, (27) long guns of various types, as well as a large cache of various sizes of ammunition along with firearm accessories were located. Also located within the bottom of this closet was a container with multiple towels inside. Additionally, within this closet was a cardboard shipping box. The shipping label was addressed to "Rob Alon" at 55 Meadowlands Parkway, Secaucus, New Jersey. An inventory of all items seized can be found in the property and evidence report.

Once on the table, all firearms were photographed, inventoried, and checked for stolen. During this time, it became immediately apparent (2) of the magazines on the table were "high capacity" magazines in violation of N.J.S.A. 2C:39-3j. It was also immediately apparent the IWI semi-automatic .45 caliber rifle was an assault weapon in violation of N.J.S.A. 2C:39-5f. This is due to the fact the rifle was a semi-automatic weapon with; a telescopic stock, pistol grip protruding conspicuously below the action of the weapon, as well as a detachable magazine.

In speaking with on scene employees, specifically the head of security Ollie White and secretary [REDACTED] it was learned the office belonged to hospital Vice President Reuven Alonlayoff. It as also said by [REDACTED] the alleged owner of the hospital Yan Moshe was aware of the firearms being on the property [REDACTED] was allegedly in telephonic contact with both Reuven and Yan. Neither Reuven or Yan had any contact with any law enforcement personnel on scene even after we stated we were willing to speak with them. Reuven was reportedly out of the country and Yan was allegedly out of the state.

During this time, headquarters was able to locate identifications for both Yan Moshe and Reuven Alonlayoff. A check was then conducted of the New Jersey Firearms registry for both

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parties. Yan had no firearms history. Reuven had a reported (30) registered handguns. In the state of New Jersey, it is not required to register long arms such as rifles and shotguns. After reviewing the handguns located within the closet, it was learned all (11) handguns were registered to Reuven.

A check was also conducted of Reuven and Yan for computerized criminal histories. Neither party showed a history.

I then spoke Lieutenant Simone, [REDACTED] and White, regarding access to the firearms. The K9 was permitted entry into the office by [REDACTED] and White. [REDACTED] stated she has access to the office as well as Yan. The building also has cleaning personnel who clean the office.

With regard to the securing of the firearms, the entry door to the office is equipped with a key code lock. Beyond this door is a large office with a conference table and desk. There is also a bar with liquor, coffee bar with food on a tray, as well as collage of photos with Reuven. The office also has a bathroom. Just prior to the entry to the bathroom is the closet where the weapons were stored. This closet is equipped with a lock. However, the lock was not secured and no key was observed in plain view. It should be known the firearms and bags they were contained within inside the closet were covered in dust and dirt. This indicating they were likely within the closet for an undetermined amount of time and there was no indication the closet was ever locked.

Based upon the totality of the circumstances, including the broad access of various persons to the firearms and no clear owner of the firearms, all firearms, ammunition, and magazines were seized for safe keeping. The assault weapon and (2) high capacity magazines were also seized for evidence.

Once back at this agency, all firearms were entered into the property and evidence system by Detective Egan and I. The assault firearm was entered into NJTRACE.

<p>On August 7, 2022, while assigned to the Detective Division, Det. Sgt. Sallustio, Det. K. Bronowich, SA Haines (Homeland Security) and I responded to Newark Airport in order to speak with Reuven Alonalayoff regarding the firearms located within his office of Hudson Regional Hospital. As Mr. Alonalayoff had multiple addresses listed and it was learned that he traveled internationally often, it was unknown of where he lived or when he would be back within the United States. It was learned that Mr. Alonalayoff was arriving back to the United States on this date from Tel Aviv.</p> <p>Once his plane deboarded, Mr. Alonalayoff was brought through secondary screening by Customs &</p>

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Border Patrol. Once he was cleared, he was escorted to an interview room which is located in the same area as the secondary screening. Det. K. Bronowich and I entered the room and closed the door in order to speak in private, as just outside there were numerous people from the airport terminal. This door was unlocked through the duration of us speaking with Mr. Alonalayoff.

I introduced ourselves to Mr. Alonalayoff and told him that he was free to leave the room at any time, which he understood. I advised Mr. Alanayoff that we were there to speak with him about the bomb threat that occurred at the hospital and the findings within his office (11 handguns and 27 long guns). Due to him not being at the hospital on this day, we were unable to confirm if all rifles were his before we returned them back to anybody. Mr. Alonalayoff was cooperative and wished to speak with us about the event and the findings. Mr. Alonalayoff then stated that they were his guns within the office. I again stated that he was free to leave at any point but he wanted to speak with us in regards to this incident. He stated that he is a collector of firearms and he was going through a divorce and needed to take the guns out of his home between moves. Therefore, he moved them to his office which was locked and had a locked closet.

I showed Mr. Alonalayoff a photo of the closet where the firearms were located. He advised that this closet was in his office and this closet was built like a safe and was in the hospital since it was bought. I explained that the closet was not locked and that multiple people had access to the room while he was away. I then showed him a photo of the rifles and handguns that were located within the closet. He confirmed that these were all his firearms.

After he confirmed that these firearms were his, I stepped out of the room to confer with Det. Sgt. Sallustio briefly. I then entered the room again and reiterated to Mr. Alonalayoff that he was free to leave at any point if he wished to do so and that he was not under arrest. The door was closed and remained unlocked. He wished to remain in the room and speak with us as he was planning on responding to the police department the following day to pick up his firearms. I again showed Mr. Alonalayoff the photos of the firearms which he observed and confirmed again that these were all his. I then showed him a photo of the Kriss Vector to which he confirmed was his as well and that he purchased it from Bullet Hole in Belleville, NJ.

I read Mr. Alonalayoff his Miranda Rights in which he understood. He asked if he was being arrested and I advised him that he was going to be charged with the Unlawful Possession of an Assault Firearm and two counts of Possession of a High Capacity Magazine. He then stated that he wished to speak with his lawyer. I allowed him to make numerous attempts to contact his lawyer which was unsuccessful. Due to his cooperation, he was not hand-cuffed, but he was advised that he was under arrest and no longer free to leave. I searched him incident to arrest which was negative for any contraband.

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Mr. Alonlayoff was then escorted to Police Vehicle 12 where I sat in the backseat with him as he was transported back to the Secaucus Police Department. During the transport, Mr. Alonlayoff would continue to speak with me about the firearm and why it was considered an assault firearm to which I explained that it possessed a pistol grip, detachable magazine, and a telescopic stock. He continued to state that he bought this from Bullet Hole and was unaware as he makes sure that all of his firearms are legal.

Once at this agency, he was photographed and processed by Det. Sgt. Sallustio and Det. Bronowich. I then prepared the complaint for 1 count of 2C:39-5F [possession of an assault firearm] and two counts of 2C:39-3J [possession of a high capacity magazine]. Due to these charges being a presumed warrant, I made contact with AP Hamzelou of the HCPO who permitted this to be placed on a summons. I served Mr. Alonlayoff with a copy of his summons (0909-S-2022-376). He was then released from police custody.

This interview as well as the transport to this agency was recorded on body worn camera and marked as evidence. The photos that were shown to Mr. Alonlayoff were also placed into SPD Evidence.

I am recommending this case be closed as the actor was arrested.
